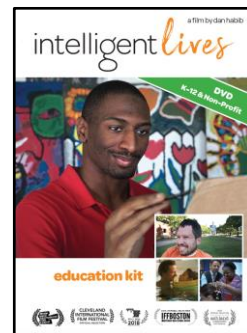
Film Screening: *Intelligent Lives*
